Farm based Agriculture

1.A- Micro Enterprise Development Programme {MEDP} for matured SHG members on Organic Vegetable Cultivation

A 10 days MICRO ENTERPRISE DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME FOR MATURED SHG MEMBERS (MEDP) ON Organic Vegetable Cultivation held at – Badasada G.P Hall of Pallahara Block, Angul district around 11.00 A.M under the chairmanship of Chief Guest, Sarpanch of Badasada, Representative of OLM Pallahara, Bankers and Mr.Gagan Bihari Nayak ,GM DIC were among the guest. In the begining of the training sharing the PM-FME & MSME SCHEME ,LOAN , ATMA NIRBHAR BHARAT YOJNA and ONE DIST ONE PRODUCT(Mango) etc. the event was marked with lighting of lamp by Chief Guest & other guest of honour in the dais. At the outset Mr. Budhadev Das Secretary, Social Development Foundation welcomed all the Members of SHG of concern Village of Concern G.P, & guests in the programme. Mr. Pratap Pradhan & Mrs. Arnnapurna Nadna (Resource Person) from SDF joined and trained the present members in the said training.

1.B -Awareness programme on Millets .

Millet was the gift of Africa to the world of humanity. However, in spite of its high nutritional value and content of dietary fiber supporting good bacteria it has always been underestimated by the first world, maybe because of its Dark Continent link. We Indians living in big cities and metros blindly followed the west by completely overlooking the food heritage of our indigenous communities, who firmly rely on millet. Today millet has emerged as lifestyle food among urban elites. There are start-ups engaged in creating an array of millet-based cookies, noodles, and teatime snacks. The trend looks positive. Bajra is popularly known as “pearl millet” and belongs to the family of Graminea. This grain is basically originated from India or Africa. The three major millet crops currently growing in India are jowar (sorghum), bajra (pearl millet) and ragi (finger millet). The foundation promoting Pearl Millet in balaramprasad village of banarpal block, angul district through participatory approach. With peoples participation at-Jhiripani, Bhandarangi village from Tumdibandha blocks of Kandhamal dist and balaramprasad and Koroda GP of Angul dist, Social Development Foundation has been promoting different varieties of millets.

1.C- Backyard Kitchen Garden .

Social Development Foundation and through support of NABARD a training programme on organic vegetable cultivation was organised at -Badasada and Jamardiha villages of Pallahara Block under MEDP Scheme. Post training many WSHGs women took up the initiative of cultivating farm products such as Brinjal, Tomato, chilli, guar and many others.

1.D- Grassroot level Training programme for Mature SHG members.

With an aim to create awareness about Government schemes, financial literacy, digital literacy, group management techniques. NABARD and Social Development Foundation, Talcher had organised a Grassroot level training programme at-JamardihaAWC Hall of Pallahara block .About 30 Women SHGs members participated in these programmes

1.E- Micro Enterprise Development Programme {MEDP} for matured SHG members on millet based food processing {Ready to cook –Ready to Eat} .

An inauguration of Micro Enterprise Development Programme (MEDP) on Millets processing, marketing and preservation for ready to cook & eat for 30 participants of WSHG's through support from NABARD RO, Bhubaneswar, Odisha. on dt-24/12/21 at- Tukuda Gram Panchayat of Chhendipada

Block, Angul dist. It was a 10 days programme, millet recipes such as rose cake, fritters, idli, kakara, Arisa, Muduki, mixture & Laddu etc were prepared.

1.F- Micro Enterprise Development Programme {MEDP} for matured SHG members on Jackfruit based food processing {Ready to cook –Ready to Eat}.

An Inauguration of Micro Enterprise Development Programme (MEDP) On Jackfruit processing, marketing and preservation for ready to cook & eat for WSHG's through support from NABARD RO, Bhubaneswar, Odisha. on dt-20/12/21 at Nagira Gram Panchayat of Pallahara Block Angul dist with support from Nabard, Social Development Foundation organised 10 days training programme at - Nagira village of Pallahara block. Participants were exposed to knowledge like Tender Jackfruit, Pickle, Panasa Chilli, Jackfruit dum biriyani, pokoda, Panasa masla, panasa dalama, Panasa Rasa, Pansa Kopta etc. Govt officials also participated and facilitated the process of training programme. A total of 30 participants participated in training and were enlightened about the MEDP JACKFRUIT "ready to cook and ready to eat" programme. All the concerned initiatives have made them as successful trainer/motivator which encouraging the participants in the vicinity.

1.G- Formation of FARM School

Promotion of Farmer to Farmer extension, the most effective and fastest in transfer of any agricultural technology, is the idea of opening Farm School in the village and at Village level under the extension reforms policy, is now working at Banarpal block of Angul District. This venture is also to support agri & allied departments efforts in changing agricultural development scenario in the block.

The advantage of Farmer to Farmer extension is due to language convenient, free in conversation, based on his/her own success, easy to believe and adopt meeting any time being in the same village, having the same agro-eco situations and same socio-economic status.

The performance of Farm school is monitored and supervised by Foundation Members and the external teachers are some time from KVK, Angul Agri & allied departments or others. The performance of Farm school working under Social Development Foundation, NABARD, KVK and ATMA, Angul initiative and supervision.

1.H- Formation of PRODUCER GROUP on Jackfruit.

"Building strong community where women are treated equal with men. A developed community where women take active participation for family and society. A producers group (PG) shall consist of 20–100 primary women producers varying the membership from activity to activity. The idea of forming producer group is to create a platform for poor producers that will enable them reliable and affordable access to livelihood support service and market linkage at the village level.

In this context, the foundation has a mandate to work with women farmer under "My Vegetable-My Land", so the primary member of the PG will be women primary producer from a rural household.

1.I- Capacity building training programme for AWW on Jackfruit Cultivation and Value-addition

Jackfruit is also known as the poor men food in the Eastern and Southern part of India. It is a rich source of vitamin 'A', 'C' and minerals. Jackfruit mostly grows as a scattered tree or long duration fruit and Odisha is the second largest producer state of Jackfruit in India, first being Tripura. The agro-

climatic conditions of Angul is immensely suitable for perennial fruit crop like Jackfruit. Jackfruits grow naturally in many backyards and roadsides without any special requirement of water or fertilizer. The crop is widely grown in Angul District in the tribal pockets of Pallahara. However, the lack of proper know-how, and access to adequate technology for preservation and post-harvest management leads to wastage and non-realizable of good income source. In this connection, our organization Social Development foundation with its sister organization RDC in collaboration with National Agriculture Bank for Rural Development (NABARD), came forward in creating awareness cum capacity building training, cultivation, value addition, jackfruit fare on jackfruit for Anganwadi worker's , women SHG's , JLG's , Producer Groups and FPO etc.

1.J Capacity building training programme for Tribal Womens on Jackfruit Chips Making.

An initiative had been taken on jackfruit chips processing by Social Development Foundation Tumudibandh, Kandhamal in collaboration with Good Samaritans, G. Udayagiri. Mrs. Pratima Pradhan CDPO, Tumudibandh inaugurated the capacity building programme and enlightened to wshg members. Mr. Shivram Digal {resource-person} carried out the program very well and trained our wshg members accordingly.

1.K Awareness programme on World Jackfruit Day 2021

Awareness programme on Jackfruit day was observed by Social Development Foundation, Talcher and RDC Kantala at Nagira in collaboration with NAGIRA G.P on dt-04/05/21. Near about 100 participants participated in the programme. Various discussions were made on the topic such as jackfruit cultivation, grafting value-addition, incubation center and entrepreneurship etc. The programme was attended by Sarapanch, AWW ASHA FLW and GRS etc.

1.L Success Stories

From plot to plate –a 'kitchen garden' story

Mrs. Jhunarani Behera, wife of Sri Kailash Chandra Behera of Badasada village of Pallahara block of Angul district is a successful backyard kitchen gardener. Her family relies mostly on farming for their food and livelihood. She has been actively engaged with self-help groups. She is qualified only up to class IX and did not have any prior knowledge of Kitchen gardening. One day she heard about Micro Entrepreneurship Development Program on Organic Vegetable cultivation which was organized by Social Development Foundation, Talcher in collaboration with NABARD at their near local Gram Panchayat and she then discussed with SDF Coordinator to participate as trainee. After training she was encouraged enough and started producing vegetables for her family through which she could save Rs 3000/- (food expenses). In addition to this she started selling some of the vegetables she'd grown apart from food she was growing for her family. By the end of the season, she could earn nearly Rs 17000/- and contributed towards her family expenses. Now they are planning to set up a cold storage unit to preserve the farm produce for marketing purpose.

M.2 Inter state exposure visit

In order to generate income from Jackfruit, With support from NABARD our WSHG Members from Thakurmunda-Mayurbhanj and Pallahara-Angul visited MIA enterprises and KVK Alappuzha at Kerala to learn jackfruit based value addition activities such as tender jackfruit preservation, jackfruit flour, raw

jackfruit powder, pickling and many more. This training will definitely enhance their income and we are hopeful for doubling farming.

2. NON-FARM

2.1 Capacity building training programme for WSHG members on Phenyl Training

Self-Help Group is a small voluntary association of poor people preferably from the same socio-economic back drop. In other words, Self-help group is a method of organising the poor people and the marginalized to come together to solve their individual problem. The SHG method is used by the government, NGOs and others worldwide. The poor collect their savings and save it in banks. In return they receive easy access to loans with a small rate of interest to start their micro unit enterprise. Thousands of the poor and the marginalized population in India are building their lives, their families and their society through Self-help groups. The 9th five year plan of the government of India had given due recognition on the importance and the relevance of the Self-help group method to implement developmental schemes at the grassroots level.

The broad Objectives of the Programmes are:-

- To enable the participants to understand and put into the perspective for the need and justification of MEDP.
- Mobility of rural women has increased for various socio- economic developmental activities through Micro Enterprise.
- Decision making capacity at household level as well as at community level has increased and become more meaningful.
- Realize the roles and responsibilities of Self Help Groups.

Planning, Execution and Target Group

The target groups involves, SHG'S members, of concern Villages of Concern Gram Panchayat, AWW's and Ngo's staff of Social Development Foundation. A Training programme has been chalked out by the NYC NYKS, AWW, Sector Super Visor of ICDS, & concern panchayat of Kaniha in consultation with Sarpanch of Bijigol and Secretary, Social Development Foundation .

2.2 Training programme on Mask Making

As part of the campaign titled “Stay Home Stay Safe” the Foundation in collaboration with Philanthropic Donor and Partnering with various Self-Help groups of Bantol gram Panchayat, Talcher involved in mask making. Raw material was provided to dynamic SHGs through SDF NGO. Even the SHG members spared their time IN mask making. They stitched 1400 mask with that raw material and distributed with help of ASHA, ANM, AWW, PRI workers and volunteers of SDF.

2} Women Empowerment

In this scenario, self-help groups (SHG) can act as a bridge between women entrepreneurs who have the will to begin an enterprise but do not have the resources to fulfil their dream, and finances needed for it. A SHG comprises a small group of women who come together to make regular monetary contributions. Emerging as important micro-finance systems, SHGs work as platforms that promote solidarity among women, bringing them together on issues of health, nutrition, gender parity and gender justice. SHGs have already made a significant contribution in developing entrepreneurship aptitudes among rural women by enhancing their skills and giving them a chance to engage in various entrepreneurial activities.

SHGs provide women entrepreneurs with micro-loans to sustain their businesses also creating an environment for them to develop greater agency and decision-making skills.

2.1 SHG Group Formation

Since its inception, the foundation have also worked extensively and established that the women of rural India can address issues of poverty by accessing credit, along with technical knowledge enhancement, solidarity, participation in politics, etc. Till date, SDF has organized 6000 women in these collectives; 10 to 20 village women in each collective come together every week to save a minimum amount and manage the business of lending. Through the SHG activity, SDF has tried to collectivize women, who are most disadvantaged socially, politically and economically.

2.2 Credit Linkages

Bank linkages are planned and done on a large scale for a prescribed amount, as decided by the bankers, without taking into cognizance the needs of the women and their capacity to repay. The process of mutual help, joint development, acceptance and internalization of SHG rules and norms are now, largely, missing. Yes, credit is certainly a lifeline for rural women. However, managing credits in groups, under the present terms and conditions, requires a different orientation altogether

3}Health

3.1 Awareness programme on Covid-19

As COVID 19 is a dangerous pandemic. It aroused a threat among the people regarding their health. In this Pandemic situation Social Development Foundation, Talcher and NABARD organised an awareness programme on COVID-19 PANDEMIC with support of the WSHG's of Tulasipada Village of Sakosinga G.P. Banarpal Block, Angul Dist. The programme was initiated by Kasturaba Group. "All these programmes were done for noble cause". As part of the campaign titled "Stay Home Stay Safe" The programme was to put an end to Corona" by distribution of pamphlets, masks, following social distancing norms, hand washing, personal hygiening and cleanness programme among their LEDP /MEDP /BLBC members.

On the other hand the Foundation in collaboration with Bantol gram Panchayat, Talcher distributed mask making. Raw material was provided to Shree Jagannath SHG and Bhagyalakshmi SHG through SDF NGO. Even the SHG members spared their time for mask making. They stitched 5800 mask with that raw material provided and sold it for about Rs 55100/- (@9.50 per piece). Both Shree Jagannath and Bhagyalakshmi SHG along with ASHA, ANM, AWW, PRI workers and volunteers of SDF NGO is organising awareness programme on social distancing, hand washing, personal hygiening, Cleanness and food materials distribution at-Munda Hating, Talcher.

Objectives:-

- To increase community awareness on the prevention and spread of the COVID-19 pandemic
- To reduce the panic and misinformation caused by the spread of the COVID-19
- To ensure the supply of basic resources including dry ration & cooked food to the migratory labour, women, children, and the vulnerable people
- To extend the first hand information and preventive measures to protect self from COVID-19 pandemic
- To build the capacities of the local volunteers and different staff to accelerate COVID-19 prevention and control measures
- To deliver all possible support at their doorstep during pre and post COVID-19 pandemic

5.0 Key Activities

5.1 Awareness Campaign

The awareness campaign is to be taken up in the operational areas with due permission of mobility from the District Administration. The following awareness services are included

- About COVID-19 virus
- Basic preventive measures
- Hand wash and sanitation practices
- Use of masks
- Maintaining social distance at public places
- Various symptoms of the COVID-19 virus
- Current COVID-19 care facilities
- Use of helpline numbers

5.2 Database of Vulnerable Families :-

Preparation of a database of vulnerable families and individual HHs on food insecurity is the first step undertaken to identify affected families, children, aged persons, single women, the physically challenged, etc. while developing the **database**.

5.3 Distribution of Masks and Sanitizers:-

To ensure safeguard measures and influence the communities for the adoption of better sanitation practices, Social Development Foundation {SDF} had distributed masks and sanitizers to 2,300 households. The women SHGs and the youth leaders have to be involved during the distribution of masks/sanitizers. It will help the villagers in educating the communities in the rural villages on basic precaution measures to protect themselves and their communities from COVID-19.

5.4 Dry Ration Delivery :-

Due to the long closure of the school and shops, Anganwadi Center (AWC) and quarantine of main wage earners of the family, food intake by children and other aged persons invariably came down. The initiative had taken up to the supply of dry ration to 2,300 HHS during this Pandemic through

5.6 Community Monitoring of Public Distribution System (PDS)

The Public Distribution System (PDS) also plays a critical role in the food security of vulnerable families in the affected villages. As a welfare measure to overcome the humanitarian impacts of the Covid-19 pandemic, both central and state govt notified many special measures related to PDS. But there are some gaps in the implementation of those measures. Thus, it was important to ensure community monitoring of PDS functioning during the pandemic. Built awareness among the rural community about the govt decision concerning PDS .Took feedback from the community on the implementation of the same and coordinated with the PDS dealer to ensure timely delivery of ration to the left out families.

5.7 Linkage with different projects

Government projects (MGNREGS) can be a good scheme to ensure cash availability for vulnerable families in this time of Pandemic. Thus, efforts are to be made to help the rural communities to get access to wages

through MGNREGS. Social Development Foundation {SDF} is executing livelihood projects in the proposed area . They can earn a living by vegetable cultivation. Foundation linked to other government schemes adequate efforts are to be made for quick payment of wages to the Labours. Support the vulnerable families in the update of their MGNREGS card with proper bank linkages and also undertake work demand campaigns at the village/Gram panchayat level to ensure their food security in post-pandemic.

4}WASH

4.1 Global Handwashing Day .

Global Hand washing Day is an annual global advocacy day dedicated to increase awareness and understanding about the importance of hand washing with soap as an easy, effective, and affordable way to prevent diseases and save lives. Every year, 1.7 million children do not live to celebrate their fifth birthday because of diarrhoea and pneumonia. Hand washing with soap is among the most effective and inexpensive ways to prevent these diseases. This simple behaviour can save lives, cutting diarrhoea by almost one-half and acute respiratory infections by nearly one-quarter. Hand washing with soap impacts not just health and nutrition, but also education, economics, and equity. It is well known that 10% of common diseases that has impact upon child health are due to dirty and unwashed hand. Unsafe Hand are responsible for intensifying diarrheal and stomach infection.
